4 A 10 minute shower uses 90 litres 



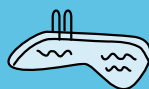

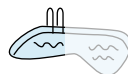

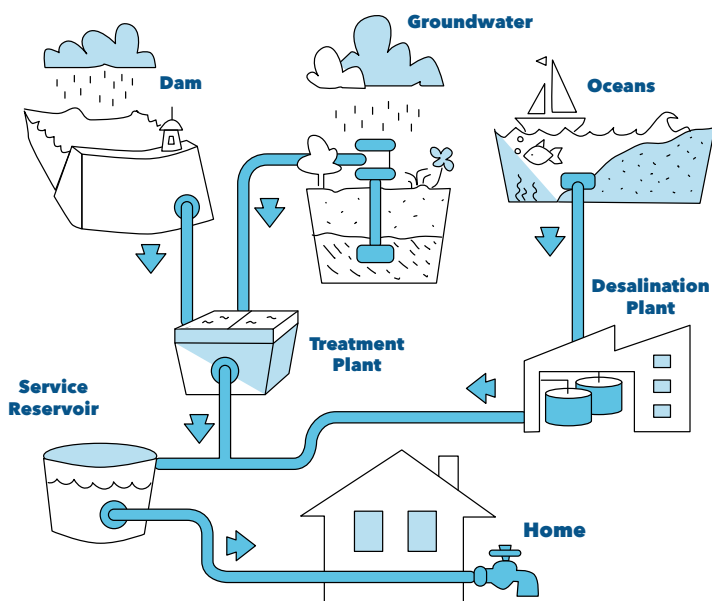


7 A leaking toilet uses 96,000 litres a year
