TERM 4 NEWSLETTER - STAGE 2



Dear Parents and Stage 2 students,

Welcome back to Term 4. Thank you to all the Stage 2 students for the hard work and effort they put into term 3. We hope you have all had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday. As usual, Term 4 promises to be another fun-filled term, full of fantastic learning opportunities. We will continue to work with students to achieve their individual learning goals.

- In **ENGLISH** students will continue to develop their skills in reading, interpreting, analysing and evaluating a variety of texts and visual images. They will have opportunities to plan, draft and publish well-structured imaginative, informative and persuasive texts. Students will continue to implement the strategies they are learning through "Seven Steps to Writing Success" to further improve their writing skills, demonstrating increasing control over text structures and language features. In Spelling, morphemic, visual, phonological and etymological knowledge will continue to be taught when attempting to spell unknown words. Students will continue to participate in literacy groups, as well as grammar, comprehension and handwriting lessons. All students should be **reading regularly at home** in order to improve their reading fluency, comprehension and confidence.
- In MATHS students will further develop their understanding of concepts in whole number, place value, fractions and decimals, multiplication, division, addition and subtraction.

 Area, perimeter, time, mass, volume and capacity, 2D and 3D shapes, position using compass points, data, graphs and chance will also be covered. Students should be regularly practising and memorising multiplication facts. A focus of this term will be the development of students' numeracy understanding through mathematical problem solving. Students will have opportunities to examine different ways of solving mathematical problems as well as engaging in a variety of open-ended maths investigations, specifically targeted to their level of development.
- In HSIE we will study a geography unit, "Significance of the Environment". In this unit the student will be focusing on investigating of the significance of the natural environment of Australia. Students learn about what living things need to survive and how they interact and rely on specific natural environments for this survival. This includes thinking about what humans need to survive and how they source these things. The key inquiry question for the students is "How does the environment support the lives of people and other living things?"

- In **Science and Technology**, we will study a unit called "**Forces**". Stage 2 students will learn that objects move as a result of a push or pull force. They will understand that forces can be exerted by one object on another through direct contact or from a distance. Students will question, explore and experiment, investigating different types of forces, including gravitational force and magnetism. To conclude the unit, students will follow the design and produce process, exploring how forces are used and interact in a product or system. The key inquiry question for the students is "How can objects affect other objects with or without touching them?
- In PDHPE our focus is "Health, Wellbeing and Relationships". Students will develop the knowledge, understanding and skills important for building respectful relationships, enhancing personal strengths and exploring personal identity to promote the health, safety and wellbeing of themselves and others. Students will explore contextual factors that support and contribute to their identity and emotional responses in varying situations. They will also explore how to build and maintain caring, respectful and inclusive relationships.
- In CAPA students will continue attending weekly Music lessons with Mrs Covell. Visual Arts will be taught by the class teachers and Mrs Bacon.
- CLASS SPEECHES will continue this term. Children are expected to deliver their prepared speech in the week it is due. All students must use palm cards and are welcome to present their information on a poster or PowerPoint presentation. Time limit is 2-3 minutes.

PBL stands for 'Positive Behaviour for Learning' "Together we provide a respectful, happy and friendly school environment where everyone strives to achieve excellence." In term 4 Stage 2 will be involved given explicit weekly lessons and reminders in and out of the classroom teaching the positive behaviours and reviewing the expected and appropriate behaviours within different settings of the school environment and the wider community. Our positive behaviour expectations are based around the core values of: RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY and EXCELLENCE.

Wear your hat in the playground
Take turns during games and share resources
Clap politely at assembly
Listen when teachers are speaking
Be patient and polite at the office

RESPONSIBILITY: Right place, right time and right uniform

Be punctual, polite and prepared

Wear the correct uniform every day

Wear your hat for recess, lunch, sport or any other outside activities

Use an inside voice in the classroom

Visit the canteen early enough to finish anything you buy before the bell rings. Use the toilet and recess and lunch

Line up quickly and quietly

Return your library books on the due date

Put your rubbish in the bin or take it home (or reuse containers where possible)
