

- 1. Participants must be a current member of the Wimmera Regional Library. Membership is free and available at any WRLC branch library.
- 2. Multiple entries are accepted but each must be accompanied by a separate entry form.
- 3. Entrants may enter more than one category if they are eligible e.g. teen entering as an adult.
- 4. Entries must be an original and unpublished work of the author.
- 5. WRLC reserves the right to have all entries undergo a prejudging process and reserves the right to reject works over the nominated word limit.
- 6. Word limits apply. Adults: up to 3000 words; Teens: up to 1500 words; Foundation/Prep Grade 3: up to 200 words; Grade 4 to Grade 6: up to 500 words.
- 7. WRLC reserves the right to not award prizes.
- 8. Entries from persons under 18 years of age are to be verified by parent/guardian/teacher as the entrant's own work.
- 9. All entries are to be typed or clearly written on A4 paper. No folders are to be used.
- 10. Entries will not be returned and entrants are advised to retain a copy of their work.
- 11. In order to ensure anonymity in the judging process, the author's name must not appear on the entries. All personal details should only be included on the entry form.
- 12. Announcement of winners and presentation of prizes will be held at the Horsham Library on Wednesday 19th June commencing at 7pm.

Prizes:

Adult: 1st \$450; 2nd \$250; 3rd \$175. Teen: 1st \$250; 2nd \$175; 3rd \$150.

<u>Primary School</u>: P-3 \$40; 2nd \$30; 3rd \$20. Gr4-6: 1st \$50; 2nd \$40; 3rd \$30.
