# Labour Market Information Portal www.lmip.gov.au

To assist job seekers, workers, industry and the community get a grasp of what's happening, the Department of Education, Skills and Employment regularly publishes new content on the Labour Market Information Portal website (LMIP). LMIP provides information, research and analysis about Australia's employment landscape.

A **new interactive dashboard** showing key labour market indicators is now available on the portal. It contains data about national, state, territory and regional labour markets based on the Australian Bureau of Statistics Labour Force Survey. This information will allow users to explore emerging employment trends and monitor changes as the pandemic continues.

# Skills Match joboutlook.gov.au/skills-match

Skills Match is an **interactive tool** to help workers and job seekers match their current skills and experiences to new jobs. Developed in 2019, this tool is designed for people of any stage in their working life, however, is particularly useful today, in light of the current implications of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Australian labour market.

With the unemployment rate tipped to reach 16%, Australian workers are having to be increasingly adaptable and potentially transition to alternative careers. This site allows users to explore possible training/employment pathways based on their skill set and helps users to identify their transferable skills.

The tool similarly links users to the **Job Outlook** website, which offers comprehensive careers information.

If you are not sure what sort of work you want to do or are considering a career change, the **Career Quiz** can help you to think about your work preferences and to get ideas for careers you can aim for. Job Outlook provides a simple snapshot of the industries and occupations that are likely to be in demand in 5 years. This can be useful information when you are thinking about future study and career options.
