Spotlight: Celebrating the communities within The Cathedral Parish of St Joseph

Communion to the Sick and Housebound "Serve and be Served" - Margaret Hallinan

Bringing Communion to the sick links the person with the community of the Church, "to reveal the healing love of Jesus to those in need."

Being someone who received Communion frequently, I understood the significance of what it meant, and yet, for some reason, I was unaware of the impact this responsibility would have on me personally and spiritually, when commissioned to carry out this ministry.

For the sick, the reception of Communion, means everything, and from a Eucharistic ministers' perspective, what a feeling to know, no matter what happens, through our ministry we are able to offer those who are sick the opportunity to receive and be prepared for the Lord.

Practical considerations:

Visiting a sick person is not just an occasion to offer support and encouragement, but also an opportunity to pray with the sick.

- There is no set rule, however, I always spend some time in conversation before sharing prayer and Holy Communion
- Place the pyx which has the Blessed Sacrament—in appropriate place.
- Listen attentively and conscious of feelings that the sick person may be showing and sharing.
- Choose the appropriate prayers to be prayers to be prayed
- If sick person does not wish to receive Communion offer a prayer of blessing.
- Be conscious that the sick person may need time for silence once received Communion—respects the individual.

Ministers who take communion to the sick should consider the circumstances, needs and desires of the sick willingly use the various options that the rite provides.
