
## Stage 3, Week 6 Term 2

This past week all of our students have engaged in activities acknowledging the annual National Sorry Day which is held in on 26 May, to remember and commemorate the mistreatment of the country's Indigenous peoples, as part of an ongoing process of reconciliation between the Indigenous peoples and the settler population.



Students have also participated a number of learning activities as a part of National Reconciliation Week. In particular, Miss Shearer and the classroom

have shared in reading and discussions around the picture book Sorry Day by Coral Vass and illustrated by Dub Leffler. This is a story told using a dual-narrative structure and beautiful illustrations by Indigenous artist, Dub Leffler, this book is a factual retelling of the day Australia apologised to the Stolen Generations. Students analysed the illustrations for meaning and explored the visual historical timeline featured in the book.
