DIOCESAN AND REGIONAL NOTICES FOCUS by Fr Bryan Hanifin

Think of the last time that we let our fears dominate us. Were we concerned how others saw us? Perhaps we became annoyed because we were passed over or not listened to. Fear creates distance between people and can even cause anger and hostility. Let's look at an angry or violent person. Very often, what we are looking at is a frightened individual living out the darkness of fear. Do not be afraid. We are worth more than we could ever know. Our mission is to proclaim the love of the Father to a broken and fearful world. As Jeremiah's prayer suggests, not everyone will listen. But we must have confidence to witness to the truth, trusting always in the love of the Father made manifest in Jesus his son.

Ordinary Time in Catholic Church 2020

Because the term *ordinary* in English most often means something that is not special or distinctive, many people think that Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. Even though the season of Ordinary Time makes up most of the liturgical year in the Catholic Church, the fact that Ordinary Time refers to those periods that fall outside of the major liturgical seasons reinforces this impression. Yet Ordinary Time is far from unimportant or uninteresting.

Why Is Ordinary Time Called Ordinary?

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*.

Why Is Green the Colour of Ordinary Time?

Likewise, the normal liturgical colour for Ordinary Time—for those days when there is no special feast—is green. Green vestments and altar cloths have traditionally been associated with the time after Pentecost, the period in which the Church founded by the risen Christ and enlivened by the Holy Spirit began to grow and to spread the Gospel to all nations.

When Is Ordinary Time?

Ordinary Time refers to all of those parts of the Catholic Church's liturgical year that aren't included in the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. Ordinary Time thus encompasses two different periods in the Church's calendar, since the Christmas season immediately follows Advent, and the Easter season immediately follows Lent. Ordinary time for 2020 recommences next Sunday 21 June when we celebrate the 12th Sunday in Ordinary time.

How Many Sundays Are There in Ordinary Time?

In any given year, there are either 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time. Because Easter is a moveable feast, and thus the Lent and Easter seasons "float" from year to year, the number of Sundays in each period of Ordinary Time vary from the other period as well as from year to year.

Singing is an integral part of the liturgy and a joyful expression of those gathered (<u>Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy</u>), 112; cf. Acts 2:46). The Gospels inform us that Jesus and the Apostles sang at the Last Supper, and the Apostle Paul exhorted the early Church communities to sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with thankful hearts when they gathered (cf. Mt 26:30; Mk 14:26; Col 3:16).

The Music Ministry at Cathedral Parish of St Joseph's is dedicated to promotion of assembly song, accomplished through the congregation's participation in various hymns, songs, acclamations, and psalms.

The combination of these elements is an expression of our assembly's sung prayer in union with the entire Catholic Church. Our purpose is to have adults, youth, and children participate in our ministry with music ,recognising that performing musically is an important part of many people's spiritual and worship life.

Our mission of ministry with music is to provide support and encouragement for all parishioners, musicians, and members of our community as a whole as they seek and share Jesus Christ as spiritual food for life's journey, centring its life on the worship and celebration of the Eucharist.

Our commitment is to do well for the music for the liturgy, which is central to our life together as a parish community, so that our worship helps us to retain our lives' fullest powers and possibilities.

Our support, therefore, is to reflect the excitement and passion of the church, people, and programs, adding to the attractiveness of Cathedral Parish of St Joseph as a place of worship and beauty.

Dear Parishioners,

With the lifting of some restrictions by Queensland Health, I will be opening St Joseph's Cathedral and St Paul's Church Gracemere this weekend, 20 - 21 June for the Celebration of Mass.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING;

The Cathedral Parish have opted to comply with the Industry COVID Safe Plan.

Masses in the Cathedral will be limited to 100 people (babies included) All persons (excluding household members/families) will sit socially distanced at 1.5meters in groups of 20.

The Priests, Readers, Musicians will be included in one '1' of these groups of 20.

St Paul's Church

There will be 30 persons (babies included) socially distanced (1.5 meters) allowed at St Paul's
