

DIOCESAN AND REGIONAL NOTICES FOCUS by Fr Bill Senn

"Let them both grow until the harvest ... "

In our Gospel Reading today we hear a series of parables from Jesus. With these (and indeed any) parables, Jesus invites us to view a seemingly ordinary situation through a specific God-centred lens; so that we may arrive at a more comprehensive & enriched understanding.

In the parable of the sower, the sower advises his labourers to allow both the weeds and the wheat to grow together until harvest time. This is to be done so as to maximise the growth potential of the wheat, lest the maturity and productivity of the wheat be harmed. At harvest time the weeds & the wheat can then be harmlessly separated with the wheat gathered into safe storage in the barn (for future sale) and the weeds to be gathered together to be burned.

And, so it can be with life. That at times, we need to 'hang in there' with the various difficulties that come our way; while at the same time nurturing the goodness and beauty of life .. both of which seem to co-exist together at different points in our life journey.

Our willingness to allow ourselves to live with both the weeds and the wheat can reap a rich harvest .. something we may not have initially expected when we became aware of the weeds .. and, perhaps wanted to expel the weeds & keep only the goodness of the wheat.

May we allow the love of God & his light to guide us in all things! Amen!

- Use the authorised curriculum programs and support resources
- Be available for a minimum 30 minutes each week during school terms for SRE lessons

As catechists we have the privilege of sharing the 'joy of the gospel' with our parish children.

As a catechist we try to live the following as a Christian

- Being called to spread the good news
 - Sharing the faith is a privilege
- Delivering the message with fun and integrated with life
- Value religious education
- Time commitment—stewardship each week
