Prison Ministry

The prison ministry provides spiritual and pastoral care to prisoners by chaplains from an ecumenical background. The primary purpose of the prison chaplain's role is to provide spiritual and pastoral care to people who are serving a custodial sentence in Queensland's correctional centres.

The role is to reach out to prisoners, offering consolation and encouragement, irrespective of their condition, their faith background, or their crimes, and without prejudice, judgement, or proselytising. The aim is to support prisoners through their own faith journey, regardless of what that faith is.

Each chaplain is an active member of a multidenominational team and is rostered to attend the prison on a weekly basis and conduct an ecumenical Chapel Service every six weeks.

The chaplain needs to reflect the teachings and person of Christ in the Correctional Centre through listening without interrupting, praying with the prisoner if they seek and/or agree to this, loving unconditionally and without judgement, and respecting the right of others to hold different views and beliefs.
