

Andean condor flies for five hours without flapping its wings...

Scientists have found out that the Andean condor can fly for five hours without flapping its wings.

This is because the Andean condor uses wind currents to stay afloat without flapping their wings. For the first time, a team of scientists used special equipment they called "daily diaries" to eight Andean condors that lasted up to two hundred and fifty hours of flight time.



Amazingly, most of the birds used just one percent of their howl body to flap their wings, which is just a tiny percentage of their body mostly during take off.

Learning how to ride wind currents allow most birds to long distances while minimizing their wing beats.

Scientists who study flying creatures generally consider two types of flights: Flapping and Soaring Flight.

The Andean Condors extreme skill at soaring includes flying for hours a day to look for its food.

Two giant pythons drop in for a visit By Nelson

On the 31 of August 2020 a Queensland man came home to a gaping hole in his kitchen ceiling and two giant snakes making themselves comfortable on the floor.



David Tait had the shock of his life on Monday morning when he entered his Lacey's Creek home near Dayboro, northwest of Brisbane.



The carpet snakes, 2.8m and 2.5m long, together weighed an estimated 22kg, so heavy they smashed a hole in the kitchen ceiling.

"They're some of the biggest and fattest I've ever seen," said Steven Brown, who runs a service called Brisbane North Snake Catchers and Relocation.

"They might be two males who were having a fight over a female — it's hard to tell between males and females unless they're mating.

"There could still be a female up in the roof, but there was no crawl space so I couldn't get in to see."

Mr Tait said he had occasionally seen snakes basking* on his metal roof on cold mornings, but had never heard movements in his roof before.

"We have a lot of bush around here so you do see snakes," Mr Tait said.

"When I came back this morning there was a large slab (of ceiling fibro) on the kitchen table.

"I guessed what had happened and went looking. I found one snake in the bedroom and we found one in the lounge room.

"Steven was really professional. He gave them a pat to see if they would cause any trouble, sort of pushed their heads away and opened a black bag and they just crawled inside.

"It was over pretty quickly, but I certainly didn't want to handle them."

Mr Brown said although carpet snakes could grow to 4m long, 3m was considered about the largest size in the wild.

He relocated both at a state forest about 1km away.

Although carpet snakes like those that visited Mr. Tait's kitchen are not venomous, if you are living near the bush always check for snakes.

Mice keep muscles after one month in on the ISS


A research team led by Dr Se-Jin Lee, sent 40 female mice to the space station in December 2019.

In a paper, Dr Lee said the 24 regular untreated mice lost up to 18 per cent muscle and bone mass in weightlessness as expected. But the eight "mighty mice", which launched with double the muscle, maintained their bulk.

Some ordinary mice that were given a dose of the mighty mice drug after returning built up more muscle than their companions.

"The only silver lining of COVID is that we had time to write it up very intensively and submit the results for publication" said Dr Emily Germain-Lee who is also Dr Lee's wife

While they were happy with their findings, the two know that more work needs to be done before giving it to people (without causing serious damage).





The scientists finished their experiments just in time, as COVID was about to hit the US.

Though it is not good to test products on animals, the results hold promise for preventing muscle loss in astronauts on space trips long enough to cause it, as well as people on Earth who have to stay in bed or use wheelchairs.

World's loneliest elephant free to find friends By Dina



On September 7th 2020 an elephant famous for being the "world's loneliest" will at last be released from the Pakistani Zoo after a very long time.



Kaavan the elephant has lived at a zoo in the Pakistan capital of Islamabad in terrible conditions for more than 35 years.

Martin Bauer, an agent for animal rights, said the elephant has been finally given medical approval to travel, most likely to Cambodia, where he will find friends and better conditions.

In May, Pakistan's supreme court ordered the Marghazar Zoo closed because of its extremely bad conditions.

"Vets gave the overweight elephant Kaavan a full medical examination at the zoo on Friday," said Mr Bauer.

Rescuing Kaavan from the zoo attracted the attention of animal activists around the world, who have fought for his relocation since 2016.

"Unfortunately, the rescue comes too late for two lions that died during an attempted transfer at the end of July, after local animal handlers set a fire in their enclosure to force them into their transport crates," Mr Bauer said in a statement released on Saturday.

"His recovery will be a long one," said Mr Bauer, "adding that Kaavan's wounds are more than just physical. He also suffers behavioural issues."

Kaavan, who lost his partner in 2012, has battled loneliness as well as poor living conditions. Both have taken their toll.



This is why we should not keep animals in cages or in extremely bad conditions. We should let animals free and not keep them in zoos like Kaafan.

"HeroRat" Magwa Wins Gold Medal His Incredible Life Saving And Bravery

It may seem odd to hear that a rat has won a medal, but it's true! He won this medal for bravery and devotion to duty. He received his award on the 25th of September 2020 by British Veterinary. Over the past 5 years Magwa has saved

hundreds of lives by detecting 39 landmines and 28 unexploded items in Cambodia.

Magwa is one of many rats that's been trained to detect landmines by Belgium based charity since the 1990s. Every time they completed a task, they would receive a treat for rats, they are really easy to teach and are light enough to walk over the explosives and not launch them. The rats that use their scent are more effective to identify the landmines then the metal detectives.



Magwa is the charity's most successful HeroRat. Magwa can sniff a whole basketball court in 30 minutes and a human would take 4 days with a metal detector! Magwa has cleared about 141,000 square meters.

His effort has allowed communities to work and live, without fear of losing a life or limb. Don't worry Magwa will save the day.






Biggest black hole ever detected By Revana



Adelaide scientist of the international research team. Have discovered the biggest black hole collision ever found! These black holes collided when the universe was about 7 billion years old. Since then it has been coming towards us.

Physique professor David Ottway explained that massive black holes exist in the middle of most galaxies such as our own, he also explained that black holes become bigger by merging with dead stars.



This is the first detection of a black hole using gravitational waves. It is very big that they didn't think something that big could ever existe! That is because stars 65 to 130 times

the mass of our Sun are believed to disintegrate*, without leaving a black hole behind, at the end of their lives.

The collision, captured by observatories in the US and Europe in May last year It created black hole 142 times the mass of our Sun.

In conclusion this huge black hole (the mass of the sun) was developed 7 billion years ago and has been coming towards Earth ever since!

So stay on high alert! You never know when it might swallow us up!

Second gold rush on the verge in Queensland

Victoria's goldfields in Ballarat, Bendigo and Stawell estimate that they are close to a second gold rush. A multitude of exploration licenses have been issued to many companies who are seeking their own chance at fortune.

The state government estimates that there is almost as much gold still left underground, as what was taken out during the gold rush. In the past five years, gold productions have almost doubled, so thousands of jobs are now being provided.



Over 200 exploration licenses have been made and there are still another 120 which have been lodged by the government in recent months.

Most gold is now found in very small amounts such as 5g, however, last year a retiree got lucky and found a 2kg nugget, that was worth 160 000\$ at the time.

Now, because people are more aware about the environment, all the main gold mines are underground which creates less pollution.

If Queensland miners' hints about a second gold rush are true, then Australia will be able to move forward from the COVID-19 crisis to a steady and forward thinking future.





- 1 cuillère à café de levure chimique
- 1 cuillère à café de sel

- 1 tube (0,75 once) de gel de décoration rouge

Voici la recette:

- 1. Mélanger le beurre, le l'œuf, l'extrait sucre, d'amande et l'extrait de vanille dans un bol mélanger. Battre avec un batteur électrique; ajouter graduellement la farine, la levure chimique et le sel en battant continuellement: réfrigérer 20 à 30 minutes.
- 2. Préchauffer le four à 325 degrés F (165 degrés C). Graisser légèrement les plaques à pâtisserie.
- Retirer la pâte du réfrigérateur en petites quantités. Versez 1 cuillère à café à la fois sur un morceau de papier ciré. Utilisez le papier ciré pour rouler la pâte en un biscuit fin en forme de Appuyez doigt. sur une amande dans une extrémité de chaque biscuit pour donner l'apparence d'un ongle long. Pressez le cookie près de la pointe et à nouveau près du centre de chacun pour donner l'impression de jointures. BAT'S CUPCAKES

INGREDIENTS

How to make the chocolate cupcake. (this batter makes around 12 cupcakes) 4 tablespoons of unsalted butter 1/4 of vegetable oil ½ cups of water 1 cup of all-purpose flour 1 cup of granulated sugar 1/4 cup plus two tablespoons of unsweetened cocoa powder (not Dutch process) 34 teaspoons of baking soda 1/8 teaspoons of salt 1 large egg 1/4 cup of buttermilk 1 teaspoon of pure vanilla extract

INGREDIENTS FOR **DECORATIONS:**

1 ½ C.frosting 12 regular oreos 24 mini oreos 24 brown m&ms or chocolate chips

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Frost the cooled cupcakes
- 2. Split the oreos as carefully as possible so you don't break them.
- 3. Place the M&Ms on the cream side of the mini oreos to make eyes and then and then use frosting to place them onto regular sized oreos.
- 4. Break a mini sized oreo circle in half and use frosting to make them look like ears.
- 5. Press the bats "face" into your cupcake and then break a regular sized oreo cookie in half to make wings and press them into the frosting! And there you have it, a perfect halloween bat!

HALLOWEEN CUPCAKES

INGREDIENTS

- 370g packet chocolate cake mix
- 85g packet lime flavoured jelly crystals
- 180g packet sour worm lollies

• 12 x 12cm lengths licorice strap

METHOD

- Step 1 Preheat the oven to 180°C/160°C fan-forced. Line a 12hole, 1/3 cup-capacity muffin pan with paper cases.
- Step 2 Make cake following packet directions. Spoon mixture evenly between paper cases. Bake for 18 to 20 minutes or until a skewer inserted in the centre of 1 cupcake comes out clean. Stand in the pan for 5 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack to cool.
- Step 3 Meanwhile, make jelly following packet directions. Pour jelly into a medium heatproof bowl. Refrigerate for 45 minutes or until almost set.
- Step 4 Using a small knife and leaving a 1cm border, cut a 1cm-deep circle from the top of each cupcake. Using a small spoon, scoop out the centre of each cupcake to make a 3cm-deep hole. Spoon jelly into cupcake holes. Poke sour worms into jelly. Insert 1 piece of licorice into jelly in each cupcake, to form a handle. Serve.

RECIPE NOTES: Spoon jelly into cupcakes just before serving.
