CIS AFL SELECTION TRIALS

Eight teams were named, and all the teams played four games on the day on the synthetic fields at Lionel Watts Reserve French's Forest.

Liam played in the mid field and produced some great marks when under pressure and was heavily involved in his teams set up of scoring opportunities. After the four games had been played the selectors named twenty boys to represent CIS at the State Championships.

The CIS team is always extremely hard to beat at the Championships with them having won three out of the last four years at the event. Neither of our students gained selection but both are to be congratulated for representing our School at the selection trials.
