

Voluntary Contributions and Charges ~ 2023

Dear Parents,

Financial support provided by parents has always played a significant role in enabling the provision of resources that extend the school's capacity to add value to students' learning experience.

Parents, who contribute financially to the school through the voluntary contributions, assist in the maintenance of the education resources at a level needed to meet children's needs in a constantly changing educational environment.

*The Glengarry Primary School Board has endorsed the schedule of Contributions and Charges for 2023. The schedule is broken into four sections and will allow you to estimate all costs that **may** be incurred throughout the school year.*

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

The term relates to the monies requested from parents towards the cost of materials, services and facilities used by K-6 students in the educational program.

The total amount of voluntary contributions parents and carers are being asked to give is within the \$60.00 maximum set in the School Education Act 1999 (WA). Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure on materials, services and facilities directly used or consumed by the students across the eight learning areas as set out in the curriculum framework.

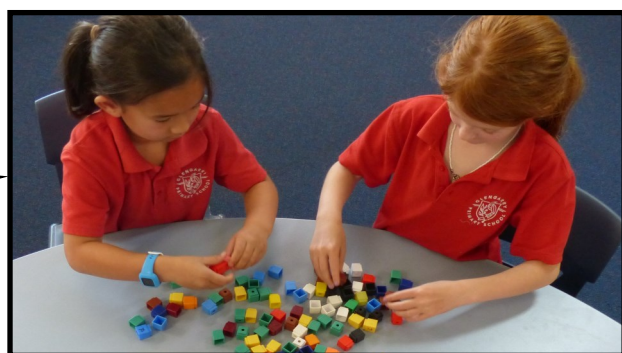
While contributions are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family makes a contribution to the cost of supplementing funding gained from other sources.

*As outlined above, your contributions **greatly support** curriculum budgets. Should the collection of Voluntary Contributions be less than 80%, the shortfall places considerable strain on our budget and directly effects what materials can be purchased for curriculum areas to support student learning.*

CHARGES

Charges are associated with specific learning activities available to all students, but conditional on a payment being made at the time of the excursion or incursion.

A breakdown of estimated charges has been included in the schedule below.

Students will only incur charges costs when they are involved in a particular activity – the amounts indicated on the schedule represent the maximum charged for scheduled activities during 2023.

The charges schedule includes costs associated with -

- Specific learning activities available to **all** students and conditional on a payment being made, e.g. incursions, excursions, etc.
- Specific learning activities available to **selected** students and conditional on a payment being made, e.g. PEAC, School of Instrumental Music (SIM) program, etc.

Other activities available to **all** students and conditional on a payment being made, e.g. School Photos, Book Fairs, Book Club.

PERSONAL ITEMS

Items for personal use in the education program.

Parents are responsible for the provision of personal items for a student. The charge for **personal use items** (stationery lists) will vary from student to student and includes:

- Items that all students use in daily lessons – e.g. stationery items, calculator etc.
- Consumable books for personal use – e.g. scrapbook, spelling book. Other requirements - art shirt, tissues, diary and library bag etc.

Your child will need to have the listed materials each day so it may be necessary to replace some items throughout the year. The recommended list of materials for 2023 will be forwarded to you in Term 4. Supplies may be purchased through the suggested supplier, CAMPION.

You are not obliged to use our supplier.

Please be advised that charges listed reflect a maximum amount as far as can be estimated at this stage. Charges may be less; for example the following applied in 2022

Pre-Primary to Year 4 Swimming: \$50

Year 5 & 6 Swimming: \$22.50

Families will be informed of pending expenses required when each activity takes place.

OPTIONAL COSTS
