NAIDOC ART COMPETITION

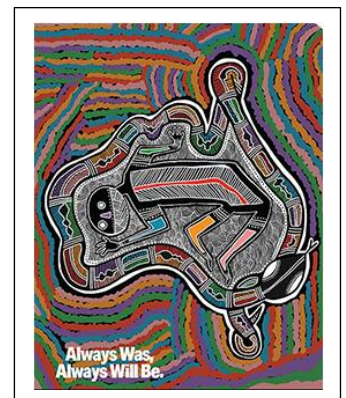
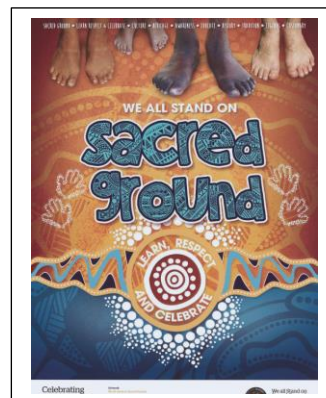
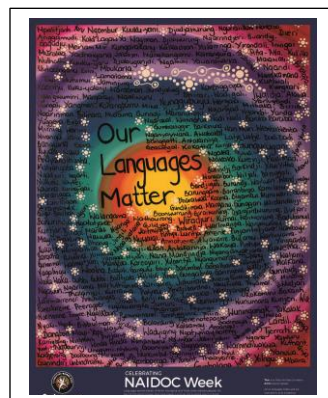
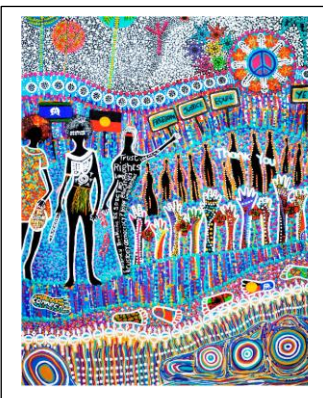


With NAIDOC week fast approaching, the South East Region Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander team will be conducting a region wide NAIDOC Art Competition open to all P-12 students enrolled in a South East Region school.

NAIDOC 2023 theme is **FOR OUR ELDERS**

The competition allows schools and students to display their creative talent, build on their knowledge of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and to celebrate and contribute to NAIDOC week within their own community.

The competition will open from Monday February 13th and will close Friday March 31st 2023. The winning artwork will be used to promote NAIDOC week throughout South East Region schools and be displayed on the SER NAIDOC Awards in June 2023. Terms and Conditions attached.

Terms & Conditions

- I. Entry is open to **all P-12 students** enrolled in a South East Region State School.
- II. All art work should be representative of the 2023 NAIDOC theme: ***For Our Elders***, and be inspired by Aboriginal &/or Torres Strait Islander perspectives.
- III. All art work should **include the theme's words: *For Our Elders***.
- IV. Start Date: **Monday February 13th, 2023**, End Date **Friday March 31st, 2023 4pm**.
- V. Entries may be drawn or painted on paper no larger than A3 size.
- VI. Digital art entries must be equivalent to A4 paper dimensions in pixels at 300 DPI: JPEG format. (2480 pixels x 3508 pixels which should be maximum 10mb in file size).
- VII. Digital entries to be emailed to FirstNationsEducation.SER@qed.qld.gov.au , if you have problems with emailing due to file size, please contact us for an alternate submission point.
- VIII. All other entries **must be mailed or delivered to the SER Regional office by 4pm, Friday March 31st, 2023**. (Mail: P.O. Box 492, Oxenford, Qld, 4210: Physical: Level 1, 340 Hope Island Road, Hope Island).
- IX. No responsibility will be taken for lost, delayed or misplaced entries.
- X. All entries must be clearly labelled with the student's name, age, school and year level, either on the back of the artwork or in the email for digital pieces.
- XI. Whilst the Department of Education will take all possible care, no responsibility will be taken for any damage, which may occur during the displaying of the artwork or within the competition period.
- XII. All Finalist Artwork entered will be displayed/hung at the South East Regions 2023 NAIDOC Exhibition.
- XIII. The judging will take place after the competition closes. The judges' decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered in to.
- XIV. After judging, the winning artwork will become the property of the South East Region Department of Education and may be used to promote the South East Region's 2023 NAIDOC Awards and/or on the South East Region 2023 NAIDOC Awards.
- XV. The winner will be notified on Friday April 28th, 2023.
