National Museum of Australia

Our new inquiry topic focus is on 'Change'. Students are required to investigate how life has changed in Australia over time. Year 1 students will participate in the *Then and Now* program at the National Museum of Australia. This is a museum educator-led program where students handle objects and explore the galleries to investigate how life has changed in Australia over the past 100 years. This will help students understand continuity and change and give them an opportunity to explore the collection of the National Museum of Australia. Students will be provided with a hands-on exploration of a diverse collection of objects to facilitate discussions about the past and the present, as it relates to objects in the home.

The coordinating teacher is **Fiona O'Hare**. The staff will be carrying a mobile phone to be used if needed for contact with the group, or for calling assistance in an emergency. The staff will also carry a first aid kit.

Parents should also be aware that no automatic insurance is provided by the ACT Government in respect of injuries to students, non-enrolled children or yourselves should an injury occur on an excursion. You may wish to consider taking out personal insurance cover for yourself and/or for students and non-enrolled children accompanying the excursion.
