Notice to Parents & Current Cancellations

Dear Parents/Carers

The NSW Department of Education is introducing proactive measures to limit the impact of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in our schools.

Mark Scott, Secretary of the Department of Education, announced yesterday that schools would adopt social distancing measures requiring them to cancel assemblies, excursions, travel, some events and conferences. Mr Scott said these measures are precautionary and designed to reduce exposure via non-essential gatherings.

In line with Federal Government advice anyone who has returned from overseas travel is asked NOT to attend school for 2 weeks whether showing symptoms or not to keep our school community as safe as possible.

We also ask all parents to keep their child at home if they are unwell. If your child presents to sick bay, they will be required to be picked up immediately.
